Gene Kohrman reported that three people were in a boat on Sabine Lake when they had motor problems and the boat capsized. Two decided they would swim for it and died in the process. The third person was rescued. So it is always better to stay with the boat and wait for help. Gene also reported when people are anchoring on the lake they should watch for currents. It is wise to tie about fifty feet of line to a life jacket or any thing that floats and let it drift behind your boat to use as a lifeline. There were 710 boating accidents last year in the state of Texas and 67% were drowning out of that number 87% were not wearing life preservers.

Terrell's Corner ' a tribute to Terrell Adkisson's witty messages from the past! '

What a beautiful spring day ! Now just why are you not enjoying your yacht club and the amenities of boating; which includes, fishing, sailing, and just plain ol' water sports? Heck, the weather is great, not too cold, not too hot . . . and where are you this weekend? Yep, a couch-tater bug, you beeee! Why, just throw a lawn chair or two in the back of the Edsel, burger makings and a cooler of ice cold beverages (ice tea, that is). Now point your car in the direction of your yacht-et club; COME ON DOWN and we will have an old fashioned picnic and an afternoon on the water. You might want to perform a little Spring maintenance on your vessel while you are at it! The following article might prove useful during your Spring inspection:

Murphy's List of Diesel Engine Spares (borrowed from a recent Cruising Compass Newsletter)

When you are assembling the spare parts you need for your diesel auxiliary, it's smart to consult Murphy, who knows that if it can go wrong, it will go wrong! And let's not forget that usually what breaks is not what you expected. But that doesn't mean you have to carry a complete rebuild kit for your engine, unless you are headed for a year in the Antarctic or some other godforsaken place.

Here's what's likely to go wrong with you diesel engine and what to carry for repairs:

Bad fuel: this is the most common problem and can be tricky to fix. You should have a high quality filter on your fuel line and a fine fuel filter on the engine. If your fuel has water in it –the usual suspect—then the engine will be blowing white exhaust and you are in danger of damaging the fuel pump. Don't run the engine with a lot of white smoke – not steam, smoke—coming out. You will need to pump the water out of the lowest corners of your fuel tanks. . .or, if you are lucky, your tanks have drains for this purpose. Once the water has been mostly eliminated, add an alcohol diesel treatment that will emulsify the remaining water. Then change the gross and fine filters. You may have to change them again after a few hours of running. Tools and parts needed: small hand pump with extension; diesel treatment; spare filters.

Fouled injector: You will know you have a fouled injector (which can be caused by carbon build up in the cylinders), when you see billows of black smoke coming from the exhaust. It can be hard to determine which injector is the culprit without removing them one at a time and having a look. A fouled injector will have hard, black carbon deposits around the injector nozzle. You can try removing this carbon by soaking the injector in kerosene or diesel and then cleaning it with a fine wire brush. But you may not succeed and, in such a case, you will have to replace the injector and then bleed the fuel system before restarting. Spares needed: injector and suitable sealing washers.

Water in the crankcase: This is a serious problem and happens all too often when the anti-siphon loop on the raw water cooling system fails due to a blocked vent and thus allows water to siphon into the engine and down into the sump. If you run the engine with a lot of water in the oil you will kill it dead. That's why it is vital to check the engine oil every morning before setting off and every afternoon at the end of a day of sailing and motoring. If you get water in the sump, you have to pump it out and then flush the engine with a light mixtures of diesel and motor oil several times, changing the oil filter each time. But first you need to clean the vent on the anti-siphon loop to prevent more damage. Spares needed: Enough oil for multiple changes; enough filters for those changes; diesel; containers for waste oil.

Conch Salad #1 (serves 6)

- 3 or 4 conch (1 lb), cleaned, bruised, and cut in small pieces, slivered or shredded.
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 1 / 2 cup chopped celery, including a few leaves
- 1 / 2 small green pepper, chopped
- 1 large tomato, chopped
- 1 / 2 cup sour orange, lemon or lime juice

salt, pepper, and hot pepper to taste. (Hot pepper – Tabasco or crushed bird pepper)

Mix well and chill at least one hour

Surprise Carrot Cake

(from Philadelphia Cream Cheese Cookbook)

1 - 8 oz package of cream cheese

1/4 cup sugar

1 egg beaten

2 cups of flour

1 3/4 cups of sugar

2 tsp baking soda

2 tsp of cinnamon

1 tsp salt

1 cup of oil

3 eggs beaten

3 cups of shredded carrot

1/2 cup nuts

Combine cheese sugar and egg. Mix until well blended and set aside. Combine dry ingredients. Add combined oil and eggs, mixing just until moistened. Fold in carrots and nuts. Reserve 2 cups of batter. Pour remaining batter into 9" bundt pan.

Pour cream cheese mixture over the batter. Carefully spoon reserved batter over cream cheese mixture spreading to cover. Bake at 350°F for 55 minutes or until done. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pan and sprinkle with confectionery sugar.

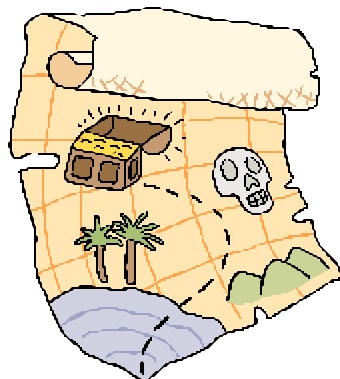


- *You (your boat) will be assigned to one of two teams consisting of several boats each.

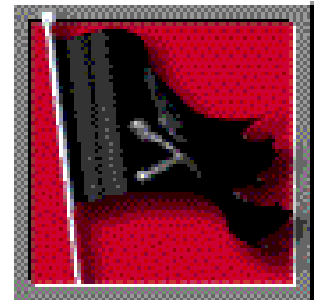
