

PLEASURE ISLAND MARINA RULES

1. All boats wishing dockage must register at the Pleasure Island Commission office.
2. The rules of the road and navigation laws of the United States apply to all vessels when approaching or leaving Pleasure Island Marina.
3. The Marina is a "No Wake Zone". Vessels must reduce speed in the vicinity of the basin so that no visible wake is produced.
4. Repairs performed in the slip area must be done in such a way as to not infringe upon the rights of other boat owners or contaminate the Marina.
5. The Marina float may be used only with the permission of the Pleasure Island Commission.
6. No discharge of any type into the Marina water will be permitted. The discharge of clean water from automatic bilge pumps is permitted as is periodic washing of the boats. All trash must be deposited in proper containers.
7. Animals are not permitted to run at large and must not be a nuisance.
8. Noise shall be kept to a minimum at all times. Boat owners shall use discretion in operating engines, generators, radios and television sets so as not to create a disturbance.
9. No laundry shall be hung after 12:00 noon or on weekends. No large amounts will be permitted any time.
10. Use of Commission owned (not leased) dock areas is at the discretion of the Commission officer and may be terminated at any time.
11. Living aboard longer than one week at a time will not be permitted without prior approval of the Pleasure Island Commission.
12. Fishing, crabbing, swimming or sailboarding in the Marina is prohibited.
13. Only pleasure boats in good condition and under their own power shall be admitted to berthing area.
14. In the event of an emergency during the lessee's absence (bilge pump failure, leak, bad mooring lines), the Pleasure Island Commission is authorized to make repairs as economically as possible. These repairs will be charged to the lessee.
15. No charcoal, barbecue or other cooking fires will be allowed on docks. Cooking fires are allowed on the boats if done in a safe manner.
16. The dock facilities of the Marina shall be limited to boat owners and their guest.
17. Boat owners must notify the Pleasure Island Commission in writing when guests are to use their boat in their absence.
18. Boat owners must notify the Pleasure Island Commission when workmen are expected to be aboard their boats. Unless such notice is given, workmen will not be permitted to board boats.
19. Boat owners shall not store supplies, materials, accessories or debris on the walkways or grounds and shall not construct thereon any lockers, chests, or similar structures except with the approval from the Pleasure Island Commission. Any material causing a safety hazard is strictly prohibited.
20. Boat owners shall not alter the docks or piers in any way. This includes fender material, carpet, painting, etc.. If fender material or other alterations are desired, see the Commission for approval. If approved alterations will be made at the owner's expense and shall become property of the Commission.
21. Boat owners having boats that will be leaving for an extended cruise shall notify the Pleasure Island Commission of the dates of departure and return.
22. Lessee agrees that in an emergency, or at the lessor's option, the lessor may move the boat to any other slip.
23. Transfer of boats between slips or from one slip to another will not be permitted without approval of the Pleasure Island Commission.

24. Advertising signs and solicitations for charter businesses or other professional services shall not be permitted on any boat within the Marina without written approval from the Pleasure Island Commission.
25. The use of electric heaters, sun lamps, light bulbs, etc. for humidity control is prohibited. The safest means of humidity control is with golden rods or other approved devices.
26. Boat owners must at all times conserve electricity and water. Wastefulness in these areas will result in increases in slip rental.
27. It is the Commission's intention to supply enough electricity for humidity control, an automatic battery charger, and automatic bilge pump protection. Electrical usage greater than this will require other arrangements with the commission.
28. Boat owner may obtain keys at the Pleasure Island Commission office for a fee of \$5.00.
29. Sub-leasing or lending of boat slips is strictly prohibited.
30. Boat owners shall not berth more than one boat per slip without permission of the Commission, except that tenders will not be considered a second boat.
31. Boat owners shall only store water hoses on hose racks provided or on their boat.
32. The use of rubber tires for chafe guards on boats or docks is strictly prohibited.
